Kids start in sanctuary
& dismiss to classes

New Years Sunday – 10:00 am Service Only

New Years day falls on Sunday. On Sunday, January 1, all worship services will be combined. There will be one joint worship service at 10:00 a.m. Children will start in the sanctuary, and leave after a brief children's sermon for children's classes upstairs. There will not be any adult or youth Sunday School classes on January 1. Our regular schedule will resume on Sunday, January 8.

Guest Speaker for Portion of Joint Service on January 1

The TLC Barefoot School in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, has been visited by several work teams from Bethel UMC for several recent years. During our January 1 service, Mr. Nickson, the current director of that Haiti School will share about its ministry for 10 minutes of our service. Mr. Nickson has been with the school for 12 years. He began as a teacher and worked with the couple, Linda and Tom Counts, who began this English school 14 years ago. Since that time, Linda Counts passed away and Tom Counts, in his 80's, returned to the States, but still keeps very connected to the school. A Board was formed in 2005 to govern the school. Miss Dottie Diehl, who attended our church and felt the call to Haiti, had worked briefly with Linda Counts and became the director/principal. Mr. Nickson continued to work with her as a teacher until three years ago when the Board voted to make Mr. Nickson the principal. Doing both jobs was just too much for Dottie. Mr. Nickson has continued to do wonderful work. Then, this past September, Dottie felt God calling her back to the states to live. Mr. Nickson has now become the Director/Principal. He continues to do a wonderful job, but does covet prayers for the huge responsibility he has. Mr. Nickson is married to a wonderful lady, Sophie, and they have a beautiful daughter, Damilie, who is 20 months. Mr. Nickson will give an update of how God is using sponsors here in the state (some from our own church family) to help the young needy children in the school not only receive a top rate education, but also teach them about the wonderful love of Jesus Christ and encourage them to accept Jesus as their Savior and grow in a relationship with HIM.

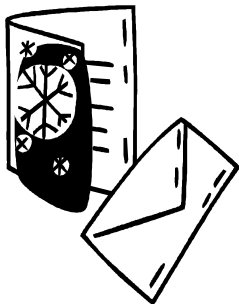
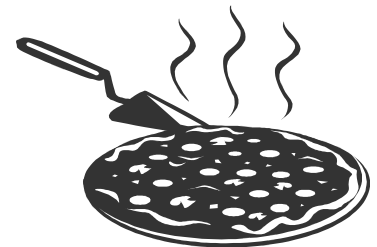

This is what the world tells us it's all about, right? For many of us the coming of a New Year is like an oil change for our lives. You know, get rid of the old used up oil, and giving us a new filter on life to catch all the garbage flowing through the system.



In reality, if we are lucky, our New Year's Resolutions are still intact by January 10th. After that our lives resort back to "normal" and we begin asking the question of ourselves: "I thought this year was supposed to be different? You know... better." For our light momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes on not what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal." (NIV) May Christ continue making us more like him this New Year.

Kids Club

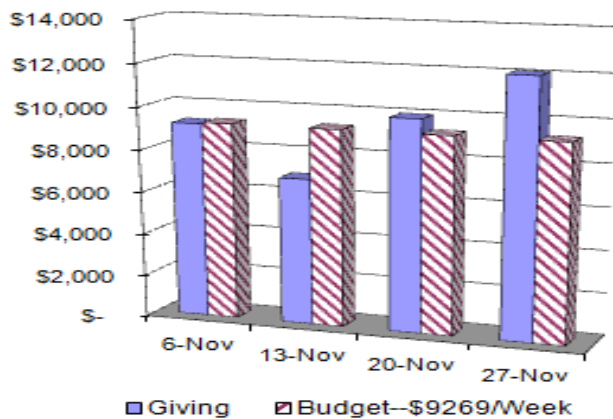

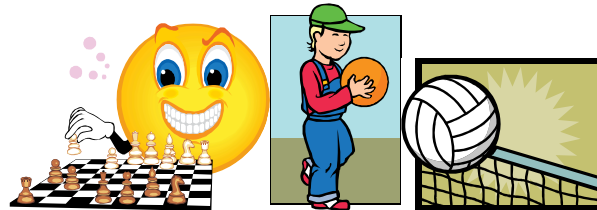
Easter Cantata Coming Soon

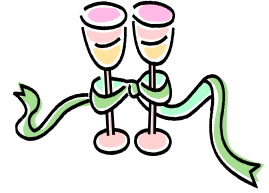
